Habitat	A habitat is an area that is lived in which has everything needed to stay alive.
Diet	The types of food a human or animal eats most often.
Invertebrates	A creature with no back bone (spinal cord).
Vertebrate	A creature with a backbone (spinal cord).
Offspring	The child of an animal.
Carnivore	A carnivore mostly eats other animals.
Herbivore	A herbivore only eats plants.
Omnivore	An omnivore eats both plants and meat.

To stay alive, all animals have 3 basic needs:




Mammals	Mammals have hair or fur. They give birth to live young. Mammals produce milk for their babies.	
Fish	Fish live in water. They have fins, scales and gills.	
Reptiles	Reptiles have dry, scaly skin. They lay eggs on land.	
Amphibians	Amphibians live on land or in water. They lay eggs in water.	
Birds	Birds have 2 legs, wings and feathers. They have a beak or bill and hatch from eggs.




Key vocabulary...

Country	Areas within a continent that are split up by borders.
Continent	One of the Earth's 7 large areas of land.
Desert	A very dry area with few or no plants growing in it.
Africa	Africa is the world's second largest and second most populated continent.
Antarctica	Antarctica is the world's largest desert. It is the coldest and windiest place on Earth. The continent around the South Pole covered by ice.
Endangered	An endangered species is a species of wild animal or plant that is in danger of extinction.
Ocean	A huge area of salt water. It covers over 71 percent of the world.
Extinct	Something that no longer exists.
Iceberg	A large floating piece of ice
Physical feature	Physical features are natural things you see all around you such as rivers, mountains. They would be here even if there were no people around.
Human feature	Human features like houses, roads and bridges are things that have been built by people .




There are 7 continents - Europe, Asia, Africa, Oceania, North America, South America, Antarctica.
