



PE Premium Funding Impact report 2015-16

The government is continuing to provide additional funding to further develop Physical Education (PE) provision in all primary schools. Our school receives £8600 per year. This money can only be spent on sport and PE provision, but schools have the freedom to choose how to spend the funding within these criteria.

Chandag Infant School has chosen to spend this funding on the employment of a PE specialist and membership of the B&NES School Sports Partnership (SSP). Below is an overview of how the school has benefitted from in these two areas.

SSP

During the 2015-16 academic year Chandag Infant School benefitted greatly from being part of the Schools Sport Partnership which is based at Wellsway School. The PE Co-ordinator Jenna Yeates left part way through the year on maternity leave and this post was taken on by Deputy Head Joy Mounter.

Over the past year the SSP has provided the following opportunities for Chandag Infant School:

Organisation of cluster meetings for Keynsham Primary Schools PE Co-ordinators. This enables links to be established between local schools, professional dialogue between PE subject leaders and ideas/dates to be organised for PE events.

Central CPD opportunities

In School Curriculum CPD and Targeted Development – Chandag Infant School was provided with a menu of support options to choose from at the start of the academic year. This allowed us to channel our support in the areas where it was most needed. This included dance training for all staff and tennis coaching and inter-school competitions for the children.

We were also provided with support from Wellsway School Sport Ambassadors on Sports Day.

PE Specialist – Sarah Stone

- Our PE specialist has delivered high quality PE lessons across the school, enhancing sport provision for all pupils
- Class teachers have had the opportunity to observe and teach alongside the specialist, enabling them to further develop professionally to ensure a sustained improvement in our delivery of PE.
- NQT teacher given opportunity to observe gym teaching by PE Specialist and then seen to take this into her own teaching.
- Class teachers have been given support in terms of observation time and specialist input to help carry out pupil assessments.
- Identification of gifted and talented (G and T) children in PE. After school sports club run for G and T children in Year 2.
- Dance club was offered to Years 1 and 2 in terms 3 and 4, enabling children to take part in B&NES Dance Umbrella event.
